



Seema Ahmad is the youngest of three children of Shaista and Muslehuddin Ahmad. She is the author of *Bridge over Troubled Waters, A Daughter's Memoir of the Man Behind North South University*. Mr. Muslehuddin Ahmad was the founder and first Vice-Chancellor of the North South University and is widely known as the Father of the Private University Movement in Bangladesh. Both Mr. Muslehuddin Ahmad and Mrs. Shaista Ahmad were founder members of the Board of Trustees at North South University. She is currently the Founder Life Member of the Board of Trustees at North South University.

She graduated in Economics from the University of Dhaka and in Public Policy from Harvard University.

She is an electoral consultant, political activist and community organizer. Seema started as a consultant for Public Strategies Group, helping turn around the government. She then worked for the departments of Planning & Development and Human Rights of the City of Detroit. In 2008, Seema worked as a community organizer for Obama's campaign and then as District Director for the Immigration campaign. She was the founder Vice-Chair of Michigan Muslim Democratic Caucus and a Michigan delegate to the 2012 Democratic National Convention. She worked as an electoral consultant for the 2020 presidential campaign and the Georgia Senate runoffs. She is currently the founder President of Child Hunger Foundation (child-hunger.org). She is also the Bangladesh program officer for World Computer Exchange.

Seema lives in the U.S. with her husband and three children but travels extensively to Bangladesh.
