Brief Introduction

Nuheen Khan is currently working as a lecturer at North South University's Economics Department. He is the Sub-Project Manager of HEQEP's 3rd Round Sub-Project "Creating an Economics Research Platform for Bangladeshi Students and Researchers", a prestigious post in Bangladeshi research capacity development area. The Sub-Project grant is worth USD 156,000 and funded by HEQEP and NSU, with an expected sub-project completion date of June 2016.

Mr. Khan also runs his own charitable society "Garbo Bangladesh Foundation" as the Founder and President, and has founded "Project Dalit" (a project to help marginalized dalits of Bangladesh overcome the discrimination they face) and "Project Kombol" (a country wide open access relief distrbution platform).

Nuheen graduated from University of British Columbia (Vancouver) in 2012 with a Masters in Economics. In 2010, he successfully completed Economics Honours at the same university, passing with 1st class and the distinction of Valedictorian. He has returned to Bangladesh to carry out several development projects, and has set up a charitable society for that purpose. He will be pursuing a PhD in near future.
