COURSE OBJECTIVE: The primary goal of the course is to improve academic writing skills of the students. At the same time, it aims to develop students' reading comprehension ability. Therefore, it emphasizes on rigorous practice both in writing and reading. In this regard, students are encouraged to write different types of essays and read various types of articles. As academic writing requires to be flawless, this course also enables students to be aware of grammatical mistakes in their writing.

LEARNING OUTCOME: By the end of this course, the students will have gained an overview of good writing and reading techniques. They will be able to accumulate, organize and develop ideas; follow the basic structure of an essay; edit their paper for common grammatical errors; analyze and summarize texts.

POLICY: - Attendance and participation are mandatory**

- Must be in class on time

- Must be aware of **PLAGIARISM** using the oral or written words and ideas of others without proper acknowledgment. Students who are found guilty of plagiarism would face serious consequences.

ASSESSMENT: Students will be assessed by assignments, quizzes, journals and sit down tests. There will be two midterm exams during the semester and a final at the end. The average of the points obtained in these three tests generates your semester grade and the GPA. Also, there will be several pop (unannounced) and scheduled quizzes during the semester. The students will be required to do journal entries, both in and out of class. All home journals can be hand written whereas the assignments must be computer composed (the accepted format for assignment: **Double Space** between two lines, **Font-12**, **Times New Roman**). The dates and topics for assignments and home journals would be announced in the class. Students will be penalized for submitting their work late. Besides, there will be no make up for quizzes and therefore, it is expected that students will not miss the quizzes.
